Happy Indigenous Day, June 21st

I remember sitting on a patio next to a city square in Rotterdam, Netherlands, while a summer festival was underway. A number of acts came and went. The largest and most enthusiastic audience gathered for a group of Indigenous people from the plains of North America. They danced and sang in full regalia, with drums, jingles, and ribbon skirts.

A second memory that comes to mind is from Mexico City's Bellas Artes theatre. I was there for a celebration of the peoples of Mexico: a variety of Spanish, Indigenous, and Mexican dances and songs. It was beautiful.

On the one hand, this is a vision of what humanity can be – diverse people who delight in each other's differences of language, values, and culture. On the other hand, the dancing and music can too easily cover over the pain and the ongoing suffering. I couldn't help but think of Psalm 137:

By the rivers of Babylon—  
    there we sat down and there we wept  
    when we remembered Zion.  
On the willows there  
    we hung up our harps.  
For there our captors  
    asked us for songs,  
and our tormentors asked for mirth, saying,  
    “Sing us one of the songs of Zion!”

There is grief and trauma, sometimes visible, sometimes just below the surface. Every Indigenous person I've been with these past few weeks, eventually let words pour out about how recent news had affected them.

And yet, the Truth and Reconciliation commission was an open hand to the rest of Canada. It was a generous request to listen, to weep, to repent, and to seek to make things right where we all could. It is my own inward sense that the Holy Spirit is especially active whenever we move in that direction.

This Indigenous day, if you are fortunate to see or hear celebrations, or even take part somewhere, consider that the dancing and the music could have been lost, or could have been withheld. Instead, the Indigenous people who

have lived here since long before the rest of us got here, continue to work for the healing of Canada. Maybe we can glimpse a vision of Jesus' Kingdom come, of the celebration feast, the healing of the nations, and the day of restoration of all that was thought to have been lost. Come, Lord Jesus.



## Increasing Capacity at Sunday Worship Services

As the maximum gathering size allowed for places of worship was increased on May 30th, we have increased our capacity level for Sunday worship services.

As you are probably aware, we are all at different places regarding our comfort level in joining a public gathering. Some are already very comfortable being out in public. On the other hand, some have hardly ventured out of their homes for quite some time. In light of this, we can care for each other by being patient and gentle with those whose comfort level is different than ours.

While progress is being made in our goal of returning to a more normal way of life, the pandemic is not over yet. In order to keep each other safe, we will continue to follow all health guidelines for public gatherings. As a reminder, here are the main ones:

1. Everyone is required to wear a mask that covers their mouth and nose for the entire time they are at the church.
2. Everyone is required to wash their hands with sanitizer when they enter the building.
3. Everyone is required to follow the arrows on the floor. The ushers are there to help you. Please look to them for guidance.
4. A distance of 6 feet/2 metres is required between households.


## Tithing during the pandemic

With the COVID-19 crisis limiting contact with others and restricting meetings of groups, please do not neglect the financial needs of our church.

We have several ways to provide your regular tithes and donations to the church:

1. Mail your gifts to the church or call and leave a message at (306) 359-1450 to arrange for an in-person pick-up. Please place your cheque in your regular offering envelope (or any envelope marked "Offering"), and seal that inside another envelope addressed to: First Baptist Church, 2241 Victoria Ave, Regina, SK S4P 0S4.
2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
3. Make an online donation:
  - Use **Interac e-Transfer** to donate from your phone or computer to [FBCRegina@gmail.com](mailto:FBCRegina@gmail.com) (*no fee or cost to the church*)
  - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (*no fee or cost to the church... 100% of your donation reaches us and contributes to our mission*)
  - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (*a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation*)
  - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (*the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation*)
