For the Week of May 16th, 2021

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it," begins Psalm 24, a psalm about the ascension of *the* king into God's presence – a good psalm to read in celebration of Jesus' ascension. Who is this King of Glory? God alone? Or a human representative chosen by God? The Christian answer in Jesus is – both!

We celebrate that Jesus ascended into heaven and was given all authority by God. His first act was to send the Holy Spirit which we will celebrate in the



coming weeks. And Jesus promised to come again to judge all people and all nations.

Paul also said that Jesus will continue to face resistance to his rule until death itself is defeated. (See Romans 8 or 1 Corinthians 15.) Is Jesus' rule arriving bit by bit throughout history? Or will it come upon the universe all at once at Jesus' return? The church has never been able to answer these sorts of questions decisively. We are not sure how to connect the Bible's poetic visions of God's plan to human history or to natural history. For example, how could nature exist without any death? Or in history, is what we see happening now, part of the God's plan or a result of the resistance to that plan? Even our children ask these questions.

From time to time, something happens in the world or in our own lives which causes us to feel deeply that creation remains, in Paul's words, "subjected to futility," and in "bondage to decay." As author Annie Dillard observes, "It is death spinning the globe." And filmmaker Werner Herzog states (perhaps in all his films, one way or another), "The common character of the universe is not harmony but hostility, chaos, and murder."

When we pray The Lord's Prayer/The Our Father (and we should every day), we pray, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done." It is a plea for all humanity and for all creation: "God come and bring an end to all violence, illness, and death." How or when this could happen is far beyond my limited knowledge and intellect.

Therefore, when I pray this prayer throughout the day, I pray that, at the very least, may "God's will be done" in my body and in my life, and that God would give me the strength to trust. I cannot answer the question as to how Jesus' rule will come to earth, but I do hope that in some small way, my life would reflect my trust in his authority and my hope in his return.

May the peace of Christ rule in your hearts.

 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church... 100% of your donation reaches us and contributes to our mission)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
