In our daily routines, in the cycle of day after day, and year upon year, may God give us strength and hope to persevere joyfully in prayer, love, and good deeds.

Congregational Meeting - November 21, 2021

Our fall church meeting was once more a hybrid affair, with some people in the sanctuary and others joining in via Zoom. We reviewed our finances to this point in 2021; giving is slightly below budget, but a legacy gift has boosted our revenue and has given us a modest surplus to the end of October. We are anticipating a good December. We also approved a budget for 2022, which we think is reasonable and faithful. A big thank you to Kevin Rich, our treasurer, for all his work in caring for our finances.

Klaus Link shared a timely word about dealing with worry.

We also elected three new members to the church board: Derrick Bellows, Roger Bellows, and Heather Russell-MacLean. Board members who will continue to serve are Ron Phillips, Kevin Rich, Adijah Pusi, Barry Lyons, Brenda Ziolkowski, and Tiffany Stafford-Lai. And a big thank you to Collin Carbno, who is retiring from the board after six years of service.

With much joy, we passed a motion declaring Rev. John Nelson, our recently retired associate pastor, as "Pastor Emeritus." The search for a minister of music continues. Pastor Joel reported that we have two solid inquiries. Our search committee consists of Pastor Joel, Laureen Snook, Amy Warren, and Brenda Ziolkowski.

We also celebrated Pastor Joel's having attained his Master of Divinity degree. A big thank you to Heather and the children for their patience through this journey, and for sharing Joel with us.

We did not talk at the meeting about who will pick up Pastor Richard's responsibilities. Richard finishes at the church on November 30 and will be moving to New Brunswick. We are now looking for someone to help with pastoral care on an interim basis. We do not want all this to fall on Joel's shoulders. We have a number of lay people who have been visiting folk in our congregation by phone, and that will need to continue. As to the various small groups which Richard led, these will not continue unless lay leadership arises from within. Learning for Life will of course continue, with a study of the Gospel of John scheduled for January, led by Annabel Robinson.

We will not be pursuing a full time replacement for Richard until we have a clearer sense of who will be coming on pastoral staff to lead music. The kinds of gifts they bring beyond music will help us determine what we are looking for in the associate pastor position which Richard has held.

New Learning for Life Series Beginning January: The Gospel of John

John's Gospel has proved to be both accessible to those reading it for the first time, and increasingly challenging the more it is read. The whole Gospel is centred on Jesus and who he is. When John the Baptist is asked "Who are you" (1:19), his answer points to Jesus. Fast forward to 21:12: "Now none of the disciples dared to ask Jesus, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord." (21:12). Our reading of John will turn this question on each one of us. Who, in your experience, is Jesus?

- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church... 100% of your donation reaches us and contributes to our mission)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
