

When I preached on Ecclesiastes in September, I shared something that was on my heart, and still is. I said:

“As we get older we can also be gripped by another fear--not so much of death as of what may happen to us before we die: loss of memory, dementia, Alzheimer’s, losing our driver’s license, loss of independence, loss of ability to do the things we love doing. I speak from experience: arthritis keeps me from playing the violin; bad knees prevent me from walking; my own memory isn’t what it was and I wonder at times where all this is leading.

In this class we will follow up those comments. It’s for people of all ages, because the more we think about these things when we’re younger the better we will be able to live well when we’re older, not to mention the fact that trouble may strike us at any time. Diaconate Report

The Diaconate selected 9 promising individuals from the 20 applicants and an appointed committee interviewed each for about an hour. All 9 of those interviewed appear acceptable, although some appear a better fit for our situation than others. At this point, we are definitely getting closer to making a tentative selection. After “search committee” selection, if the board confirms, we will need to continue with reference follow-up, more discussion/negotiations with the selected candidate, appropriate congregational input, and negotiation towards a potential contract. The board has discussed what the church can realistically afford. The final outcome may result in the pursuit of one full-time position, or two part-time positions, or one part-time position, or even no position at all. We hope to have a clearer picture to report when we come together for the Nov 17th general budget meeting.

Finances


As you can see from the numbers below, our income has generally been keeping up with our expenses. In fact, we are projecting a small surplus at the end of the year.

HOWEVER ...

As noted in previous monthly newsletters, we have not been meeting the budget that we set for 2018. In fact, it appears that we will be at least **\$25,000 below our forecasted budget at year-end**. This essentially means that, although we've been able to keep the lights and heat on, pay our mortgage and other bills, support our partner organizations, and continue to pay our staff, we have not been able to do much beyond that. This includes hiring additional staff or undertaking any initiatives to address the results of the survey conducted at the beginning of the year.

Operating Revenue to end of September 2018:	\$257,291
Operating Expenses to end of September 2018:	\$249,926
Restricted Reserve Balance:	\$183,498
CBWC Loan Balance:	280,771


