Following is an outline of the proposed TNT program. Feel free to discuss additions to this program.

On Tuesday, January 8 at 6 p.m., TNT will be introducing a new program which is a part of the "That the World May Know" series

with Ray Vander Laan. The current unit in the series we will undertake is, "Cultures in Conflict -- Paul Proclaims Jesus as Lord." The January 8 session will be an introduction to the Series, to Ray Vander Laan, and to Paul and his journeys. The series is produced by Focus on the Family. The introduction will be followed by 5 weekly sessions that start with a 30-minute video that takes you to the places where Paul's travels took him 2000 years ago, and amplifies the context in which he lived and preached the Gospel. The sessions are as follows:

January 15: Engaging the Mind: Paul in the Stoa of Athens

January 22: Engaging the Heart: Paul before the Areopagus

January 29: Turning Weakness into Strength

February 5: The Lord's Supper: Discerning the Body

February 12: Transforming the Chaos

Each Video is followed by Discussion, Faith Lessons, and Closing Prayer. Total duration is approximately one hour. If you cannot make it to all sessions, note that each session stands on its own and can be studied separately from the rest.

Our directors, Tim and Shelley took in the Christian International Camping Conference in Banff in late November, and then had two weeks vacation visiting their parents and family back in Eastern Canada. Please keep them in your prayers. Some extra year-end giving has definitely helped us enter into 2019 out of crisis mode, but finances remain tight. Pray that we be successful this year in

getting summer grant money. The year 2019 looks exciting: pray that we can break the 300 campers mark with another successful and safe set of summer camps.

Finances

The budget for 2019 was approved by the congregation at the Fall Business Meeting. This approved budget will allow us to hire an additional full time staff. The budget, however, will require a greater commitment to giving from the congregation. As discussed at the meeting, we will be stepping out in faith that God is leading our church to being more than we are now.

The financial numbers for the end of November have not altered the year-end projections that have been highlighted at the Fall Meeting and in recent announcements. However, the initial offerings for the first weeks of December are indicating a more positive outlook for our revenue at the end of the year. But we won't know for certain until our year-end financials are complete.

Approved Operating Budget to end of November: \$355,564 (prorated monthly)

Operating Revenue to end of November 2018: \$ 313,995

Operating Expenses to end of November 2018: \$ 312,032

Restricted Reserve Balance: \$ 183,887

CBWC Loan Balance: \$ 278,184

We have several ways in which you can to provide your regular tithes and donations to the church:

- 1. Place your gifts in an offering basket during any worship service or mail to the Church Office.
- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance** (**PAR**) **Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church).
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church).
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via CanadaHelps (a fee of 3.5% is deducted from the donation).

PLEASE refer to more specific information on these contribution methods that is available on the church website. You may email the church or contact the Treasurer for further details.
