






Phoenicians were the dominant Seafarers of the Mediterranean during Biblical Times (c. 1000 – 400 B.C.)







Tyre c. 333 B.C. when beseiged by Alexander the Great





- that city which stands at the edge of the sea and does business with the people living on every seacoast.




3b "Tyre, you boasted of your perfect beauty.

4 Your home is the sea.


Your builders made you like a beautiful ship;

8 Your oarsmen were from the cities of Phoenicia. Your own skillful men were the sailors.




10 Soldiers from Persia, Asia Minor, and North Africa served in your army.

They hung their shields and their helmets in your barracks. They are the men who won glory for you.


11 Soldiers from Phoenicia

They gave emeralds, purple cloth, embroidery, fine linen, coral, and rubies in payment for your wares.

17 Judah and Israel paid for your goods with wheat, honey, olive oil, and spices.

18 The people of Damascus

bought your merchandise and your products,

paying for them with wine and wool.

They traded wrought iron and spices

for your goods.




20 The people of Arabia traded saddle blankets for your goods.

- Your merchandise was carried in fleets of the largest cargo ships. You were like a ship at sea, loaded with heavy cargo.




- When your oarsmen brought you out to sea, an east wind wrecked you far from land.





- 1 The word of Yahweh was to me, saying,
- 2 "Human, say to the leader of Tyre,

'Thus says the Lord Yahweh,

"Because your heart is lifted up
and you have said,

"I am a god;

(in) I seat of the gods / God, I sit
in the heart of the seas';

And (yet) you are a human and not a god,
and (yet) you have made your heart
like the heart of God/gods—
```

By your wisdom and understanding you have made for yourself riches and have made gold and silver in your treasuries.

By the abundance of your wisdom, by your trade

you have made abundant your riches, and your heart is lifted up because of your riches—

6 Therefore thus says the Lord Yahweh, Accusation of Sin 'Because your placing your heart like the heart of God/gods,

- 7 Therefore, behold, I will bring strangers against you,
 --the most ruthless of the nations-and they will draw their swords against the beauty of your wisdom
