Why do men then now not reck his rod?* Generations have trod, have trod, have trod; And all is seared with trade; bleared, smeared with toil; And wears man's smudge and shares man's smell: the soil Is bare now, nor can foot feel, being shod.

And for all this, nature is never spent;

There lives the dearest freshness deep down things;

And though the last lights off the black West went

Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward, springs— Because the Holy Ghost over the bent

World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.



Increasing Capacity at Sunday Worship Services

Due to declining infection rates, our government has recently announced changes to the maximum gathering size allowed for places of worship, beginning May 30th. We plan to increase our capacity level on June 6th, if, and only if, the following two conditions are in place:

- 1. Infection rates in Saskatchewan have continued to decline.
- 2. We are able to find volunteers to do the additional work involved in meeting the health guidelines for a larger number of people.

As you are probably aware, we are all at different places regarding our comfort level in joining a public gathering. Some are already very comfortable being out in public. On the other hand, some have hardly ventured out of their homes for quite some time. In light of this, we can care for each other by being patient and gentle with those whose comfort level is different than ours.

While progress is being made in our goal of returning to a more normal way of life, the pandemic is not over yet. In order to keep each other safe, we will continue to follow the health guidelines for public gatherings. As a reminder, here are the main ones:

- 1. Everyone is required to wear a mask that covers their mouth and nose for the entire time they are at the church.
- 2. Everyone is required to wash their hands with sanitizer when they enter the building.
- 3. Everyone is required to follow the arrows on the floor. The ushers are there to help you. Please look to them for guidance.
- 4. A distance of 6 feet/2 metres is required between households.

Please note that, now that the weather is milder, you are asked to *head straight outside to visit,* rather than using the foyer or aisles for that purpose.

Also note that Zoom participants will continue to be fully included as part of Sunday morning worship at 11 am.


Finances

At the 2020 Fall Business Meeting, a one-time deficit budget was approved for 2021. This included total revenues of \$414K and total expenditures of \$431K for an overall deficit of \$17K.

To the end of April, our revenue is around 16% above our YTD budget. We have kept our expenses to about 7% below the YTD budget, resulting in a current surplus of \$27.1K (spending less than our income). We have been paying back the loan from our Organ Fund, so the Restricted Reserve Balance has increased, while the outstanding loan amount has decreased.






My boss always laughed at my jokes at work. But since the pandemic began, and we always communicate on Zoom, she doesn't laugh at them anymore. I asked her why.

 - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
