## Psalm 137 (KGF)

Remember, Yahweh, against the children of Edom the day of Jerusalem ('s fall), who said: "Raze it! Raze it to its foundations!" <sup>8</sup> Daughter Babylon, (who will be) devastated— Oh the blessedness of the one who repays you your recompense that you recompensed to us. <sup>9</sup> Oh the blessedness of the one who seizes and dashes your little-ones against the rock(s).



2 Kings 8:12 (NASB) -- Against Northern Kingdom, Israel: Then he [Elisha] answered, "Because I know the evil that you [commander of Syrian army] will do to the sons of Israel: their strongholds you will set on fire, and their young men you will kill with the sword, and their little ones you will dash in pieces, and their women with child you will rip up."

Against Northern Kingdom, Israel Hosea 10 (NASB) <sup>13</sup> You have plowed wickedness, you have reaped injustice; you have eaten the fruit of lies. Because you have trusted in your way, in your numerous warriors, <sup>14</sup> therefore a tumult will arise among your people, and all your fortresses will be destroyed, as Shalman destroyed Beth-arbel on the day of battle, When mothers were dashed in pieces with their children. <sup>15</sup> Thus it will be done to you at Bethel because of your great wickedness. At dawn the king of Israel will be completely cut off. Hosea 13:16 [Heb 14:1] <sup>16</sup> Samaria [capital of Northern Kingdom] will be held guilty, for she has rebelled against her God. They will fall by the sword; their little ones will be dashed in pieces, and their pregnant women will be ripped open.

Isaiah 13 (NASB) (c. 700 B.C.)







## Quotation of the "Enemies" against the Psalmist (vv. 6-19)

- One being cursed = 3<sup>rd</sup> person singular ("he");
   vv. 2-5, 20, 27-29, "enemies"= 3<sup>rd</sup> person plural ("they")
- 2) Yahweh spoken about in 3<sup>rd</sup> person ("he")
  - vv. 1, 21, 26—28, Yahweh spoken to in 2<sup>nd</sup> person ("you")



## Contemporary Use of Imprecations 3) Pray them against the Enemies of God a) Discern whether an Imprecatory Prayer is Appropriate b) Do a Self-Examination to Make sure we are Living

- in Righteousness & have Pure Motives
  - c) Always Pray First for the Person's Salvation
    - d) Always Leave it to God to Deal with the Person
      - d) Know that Justice may Not Occur in this Life
