





***Experiential Language**" **Psalm 13** (XCE REMARK) **1** How long, Yahweh, will you forget me – forever? How long will you hide your face from me? **9** Psalmist is only describing how he is experiencing Yahweh (the psalmist's perception of how God seems to be relating to him), not trying to theologically affirm whether Yahweh can actually "forget" or "hide his face" **6** Even though the description may not be "Theologically Accurate", we must never dismiss "Experiential" Language, because the Experience of Yahweh's Lack of Attention & Lack of Action is a very real, overwhelming & accurate *Feeling* (a "Theological" Refutation will probably not effectively Alleviate the Feeling)




























 Change of Addressee / Audience (v. 6): (Audience is most probably the congregation/community)

> Lament Psalms are spoken publically, in the midst of the congregation
> --although they are "individual / private" prayers, the context of voicing them is corporate worship

• Specifically the Commitment to Praise is a public declaration, thus, a type of public vow

 Context of the Thankful Praise, when God has Delivered, will also be public, within the congregation, not merely a private song of thanks (such may be reflected if the connotation is "I will sing *for* Yahweh")
