A note from the director:

Christmas Worship is a musical celebration for this season of Advent and Christmas. As believers we are taught to, "Be thankful in all circumstances" (1 Thessalonians 5:18), and for many (myself included), expressing gratitude was a challenging thing to do during the initial stages of the pandemic. At times, it felt easier to wallow in the fears and uncertainties of the situation rather than to have faith and be thankful. In preparation and anticipation for the gradual return to choral rehearsals and concerts, however, many musicians found it easier to choose gratitude over sorrow.

Musicians of faith express gratitude in the form of worship through song. The music for this concert is selected not to impress but to inspire feelings of gratitude, praise and worship to God. Symbolically, during this time of Advent, the church teaches that there is a shift from darkness into light. The texts of the well-known German hymn, *Silent Night*, in addition to the choral arrangements of *Holy Night*, *Silent Night* and *Once in Royal David's City*, allow us to reflect, remain calm, and see the light, despite the darkness surrounding us all. The piano interludes *Étude* and *Disco-Visit*, in addition to familiar tunes such as *He is Born*, *Gesu Bambino* and the *Variation on In Dulci Jubilo*, are uplifting melodies, connected by their ability to generate the emotions of hope and love.

As we approach the mid-point of the program the music is increasingly connected by the threads of light, peace and joy. The trumpet solo, *Sonata for Trumpet and Piano*, the gospel-influenced, *This Little Light of Mine*, featuring the Sanctuary choir and guest soloist, Stella Salido Porter, and the more traditional *Light the Advent Candle*, featuring the flute, awaken the spirit with texts, musical textures and harmonies to brighten the soul. The pieces, *Christmastime*, *O Holy Night*, and *The Sleep of the Infant Jesus*, featuring flute and soprano, Stella Salido Porter, are sure to bring peace to our hearts and minds.

The final three selections, *While By My Sheep*, featuring the handbells and organ, *Joy to World*, and *Hark the Herald Angels Sing* are lively, energic, and joyful pieces to conclude our Christmas Worship 2021 concert.

On behalf of the First Baptist Church community, thank you all for coming to this, the first in-person Christmas performance since December 2019. As we move from darkness to light, we want to encourage you to "Be thankful in all circumstances." We hope that you will be moved by our choirs, soloists and our special guest soprano soloist, Stella Salido Porter, and pray that this concert will inspire, and uplift you, during this challenging time in our world.
