James describes being a Christian as something new God started inside us: "The Lord gave us birth by the word of truth." (1:18) Each day, we are to "rid ourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save our souls." (1:21) This is our purpose, and it is our struggle.

James describes a battle that is largely internal.



However, this battle is engaged as we interact with God, other people, and nature. Every day, our interactions reveal the state of our heart, or our "wisdom." James does not think wise means smart or knowledgeable. For James, "The wisdom from above is pure, peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy." (3:17) Is that what we see in our interactions? In our disagreements? If we find we are "lacking in wisdom, ask God, who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and it will be given you!" (1:5)



James wanted the church to prepare to meet the, "one lawgiver and judge who is able to save and to destroy." (4:12) And, according to James, "The coming of the Lord is near." (5:8) The morality of James only makes sense with this final event in view.

I would argue that trying to make sense of our lives, the church, the nation, or the world—the here and now without also looking far ahead to Jesus' coming to set things right, leads to anger, despair, or envy in our hearts, exposed in our interactions.

I wish I could see an obvious way forward for Christians to resolve our conflicting views of "the truth," of what is

necessary right now for the church, our nation, or the world, but I am confident of this: We cannot neglect the state of our hearts, which is exposed in our daily interactions.

Finances

At the 2020 Fall Business Meeting, a one-time deficit budget was approved for 2021. This included total revenues of \$414K and total expenditures of \$431K for an overall deficit of \$17K.

To the end of August, offerings were 2% below what was budgeted. However, we have kept our expenses to about 3% below YTD budget, and we have also had some unexpected, one-time revenues totalling over \$50K. Because of this, our revenue is around 17% above our YTD budget and we have a current surplus of \$43.5K (spending less than our income).

Also, please note that we have been paying back the loan from our Organ Fund, so the outstanding loan amount has decreased, while the Restricted Reserve Balance has increased.





Tithes and Offerings

- 1. Mail your gifts to the church or call and leave a message at (306) 359-1450 to arrange for an in-person pick-up. Please place your cheque in your regular offering envelope (or any envelope marked "Offering"), and seal that inside another envelope addressed to: First Baptist Church, 2241 Victoria Ave, Regina, SK S4P 0S4.
- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church... 100% of your donation reaches us and contributes to our mission)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via CanadaHelps (a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
