Advent is right around the corner...

What is Advent?

Do you have memories of chocolate countdowns to Christmas? I certainly fondly remember the 25-day countdowns filled with cheap, waxy chocolates marking our way from December 1st until Christmas Day. But is that what we are referring to when we talk about the season of advent? Is it a countdown to a day of opening gifts, eating sweets and spending time with family around a big meal?

In the Christian tradition, Advent is about anticipating the coming of Christ. In remembering each year how Christ came as a babe among us, we have space to reflect on how Christ comes into each of our lives today. This also points us toward anticipating Christ's second coming.

When does Advent begin?

Advent does not begin on a set date each year, but rather begins four Sundays prior to Christmas. An advent wreath can be a beautiful and meaningful way to help mark this countdown to the birth of Christ.

How do I set up an Advent Wreath?

There are multiple ways to set up a wreath, reflecting the diversity of our expression of faith. Some people will find one way they like and repeat it annually. Others may enjoy experimenting with different wreath traditions across the years. Once you know the basics of the wreath, you may find it easier to choose the details that work for you. (See photos for some examples.)



The wreath is traditionally made in a circular shape, representing eternal life found in Christ. Four candles are placed equidistant around the wreath. In the centre, you will

often see a white Christ candle that is lit only at Christmas to mark the birth of Jesus. The four candles placed around the outside can have different colours and different meanings attached to them. It is common to see 3 purple candles and 1 pink candle representing the themes of hope, peace, joy and love. The purple represents royalty, repentance and suffering. It's in the midst of this season, that we take the 3rd week to represent joy using the rose or pink coloured candle.



On the first Sunday of Advent, only the first candle is lit. One the second Sunday, the first candle is lit again, followed by the second candle. This pattern continues each Sunday until all four of the candles in the circle are lit on the last Sunday before Christmas. On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, each of the four candles are lit prior to lighting the Christ candle, which reminds us that the light of the world came to us in human form.

You may have noticed that at First Baptist, we include the lighting of the Advent wreath each year, in our services leading up to Christmas Eve. When I was growing up, we also

followed this pattern at home. I'm grateful for this tradition that helped to shift my attention from the worldly aspects of a Christmas celebration, to remember that truly, Christmas is about the coming of Christ.

Depending on the stage of life with kids and pets, it's important to find a safe place to set up the wreath. You may choose to purchase a wreath from a store or find some beautiful handmade ones on websites like Etsy. You can also make a wreath out of

evergreens or whatever else you may have on hand. Want to do this project on a budget? Feel free to use white tea lights or any other candles you have in the house. Some have even chosen to line up their candles in a line rather than a circle. Choose what will work for you.

When it comes to the first Sunday of Advent (November 28th), I encourage you to light the first candle and reflect on the theme of hope. It can be helpful to read some Scripture and say a prayer that helps you focus on the hope found in Christ. Continue this tradition each week until you reach Christmas, when it is a special joy to read the story of the babe born in a manger.

Tithes and Offerings

- 2. Establish a Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church... 100% of your donation reaches us and contributes to our mission)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation) •
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
