I Hear Wedding Bells

There are several references to weddings across the first chapters of John's Gospel. Jesus chose a wedding as the place for his first sign and his first public activity. At the wedding, Jesus blessed the people and revealed his glory to his disciples.

The subject of weddings comes up again after Jesus visited the temple and met with Nicodemus. John the Baptist says about Jesus, "The friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him arrive, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom's voice. For this reason my joy has been fulfilled." If Jesus is the bridegroom in this metaphor, who is the bride?

And then we come to the story of the woman at the well, a more subtle example. In Old Testament stories, the community well was a place where young men and women could meet by chance. In fact, a number of marriages in the Old Testament begin at a well. In this story, Jesus sat with the woman by the well and, all alone, they talked. Part of the conversation was about whether or not the woman had a husband. The disciples were astonished by what they saw upon their return.



I think this is all intentional on the part of John. I wonder if John is trying to give us a sense of how much Jesus loves people, how much Jesus loves John, himself, the woman, and you. Marriage is obviously an intimate metaphor. Though Jesus' disciples call him teacher and Lord, Jesus calls them friends, and, on his final night, he describes the relationship he has with them as a union, as abiding within each other. *(See John 14-17.)* Love is the crux of his final words to them.

Marriage is perhaps being used as another picture of salvation. Many of us are more accustomed to the courtroom metaphor for salvation, with a judge, sin, guilt, pardon, and penalty. In John's Gospel, salvation is an invitation into close connection with God, characterized by trust, while sin is rejection or betrayal. After her intimate time with Jesus, the woman at the well went and brought her whole town to meet him, and the church, the bride of Christ, grew in Samaria.

May you know Jesus' love for you.



- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church... 100% of your donation reaches us and contributes to our mission)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via CanadaHelps (a fee of 4% is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
