As a child and young person I was inclined to see the 'good' Bible characters, those who were people after God's own heart, as being almost perfect: they always trusted God; they never got discouraged; they always lived on a spiritual and emotional high. But by the time I was an adult, I began to see them as human beings, created in the image of God, but not perfect, just like me. They had their downfalls. I could identify with them and their journey with God. What was true of them could be true of me. I could be a person of faith, of courage, even though I had my foibles and difficulties.

Oh how I love that Elijah was a human, just like me (James 5:17a). Like me, he was created in the image of God, but had some very black moments. He felt alone. He wanted to die. 1 Kings 19:3 tells us he was



afraid and ran for his life. But he was ultimately ministered to and directed by the angel of the Lord. He loved the Lord with all his heart and wanted to obey him...and God helped him through his dark moments. God gave him an appropriate kick in the pants and sent him on his way.

Read his whole story in 1 Kings 17-19 and 2 Kings 1-2.

In Psalms 42 and 43, the phrase "Why am I discouraged? Why is my heart so sad?" is quoted three times. And so is the response. "I WILL put my hope in God! I WILL praise him again—my Saviour and my God."

You can never get so low that God isn't there. God never left Elijah...Elijah just felt that he had. But Elijah continued living for God until the estimated age of 51 years when God, in essence, sent a chariot of fire to take him to heaven. Perhaps it was an Old Testament way of saying, "Well done, my good and faithful servant."

The novel chosen for the June 22nd study is "A Long Walk to Water," by Linda Sue Park. The book begins as two stories, told in alternating sections, about two eleven-year-olds in Sudan. One is a girl, in 2008 and the other, a boy, in 1985. The girl, Nya, is fetching water from a pond that is a two-hour walk from her home: She makes two trips to the pond every day. The boy, Salva, becomes one of the "lost boys" of Sudan, refugees who cover the African continent on foot, as they search for their families and for a safe place to stay. Enduring every hardship from loneliness, to attack by armed rebels, to


contact with killer lions and crocodiles, Salva is a survivor, and his story goes on to intersect with Nya's in an astonishing and moving way. Includes an afterword by author Linda Sue Park and the real-life Salva Dut, on whom the novel is based, and who went on to found the organization, "Water for South Sudan."

## **Tithes and Offerings**

Whether you are attending Sunday services in person or online, there are several methods that you can use to give your tithes and donations to the church:

- 1. Mail your gifts to the church or call and leave a message at (306) 359-1450 to arrange for an in-person pick-up. Please place your cheque in your regular offering envelope (or any envelope marked "Offering"), and seal that inside another envelope addressed to: First Baptist Church, 2241 Victoria Ave, Regina, SK S4P 0S4.
- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an <u>online donation</u>:
  - Use a credit or debit card to make a donation from our website. (*The church is charged a small processing fee for each donation.*)
  - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
  - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church 100% of your donation reaches us)
  - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a 4% fee is deducted from the donation)
  - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
