

Try this for a new Bible study experience...



In my work as Publications Director for Scripture Union, Canada, I try to keep abreast of what's out there that other people may be reading. It was in this connection that I recently came across a different kind of study Bible, one that combines a regular Bible with online resources that you can access by scanning the page number on your mobile device. This takes you to study notes, profiles, devotionals, videos, interactive maps,





music, and more, that relate to the page you are reading.

I was intrigued. I bought a "Filament Bible," and I'm more than delighted.

I'm now enjoying a new experience of Bible reading. Here's what I did. First, I chose the New Living Translation (NLT), which I hadn't used before. I can't recommend it highly enough.

Second, I'm very impressed with the quality of the resources that the Filament Bible links to.

And third, I signed up for a reading plan. There are several to choose from,

and I decided to be ambitious and try to read the whole Bible in 100 days.

So far, so good. The NLT is more readable than any other translation I know, without sacrificing accuracy. The layout is beautiful and meaningful. Ask me and I'll show you what I mean.

Bottom line, I'm learning new things every day from reading the Bible in big chunks.



"Don't worry," said the doctor. "When I treat a patient for pneumonia, he dies of pneumonia."



Tithes and Offerings

Whether you are attending Sunday services in person or online, there are several methods that you can use to give your tithes and donations to the church:

- 1. Mail your gifts to the church or call and leave a message at (306) 359-1450 to arrange for an in-person pick-up. Please place your cheque in your regular offering envelope (or any envelope marked "Offering"), and seal that inside another envelope addressed to: First Baptist Church, 2241 Victoria Ave, Regina, SK S4P 0S4.
- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an <u>online donation</u>:
 - Use a credit or debit card to make a donation from our website. (*The church is charged a small processing fee for each donation.*)
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church 100% of your donation reaches us)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a 4% fee is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
