Worship and Fellowship this Advent and Christmas

Fasting... at Christmas?!

We are approaching the Advent season, once again welcoming Jesus into our lives and remembering that one day, we will all see Jesus face to face. We are encouraged to let Advent be a time of prayer and preparation for Jesus' advent in our lives.

You may be seeking for something to help you slow down during the Christmas season or something to help you focus on Jesus. Some make use of daily advent reflections. A few are suggested below.

Fasting is also meant to be part of this season. As we read in Ezra and Nehemiah, God's people have always intentionally had times of fasting and times of celebration. Through fasting, we practice our conviction that we do not live by food alone but by God's word imparting life to us. It's impossible for Advent to be as somber a fast as Lent. Like all times of watching for a birth, the preparation and waiting is full of joy.

Perhaps you would consider fasting on the Wednesdays leading up to Christmas.

Fasting can mean taking nothing or sticking to just water. A more common approach is to limit yourself to small portions of whole foods, things like nuts, fruits and vegetables. It has also become common to turn off devices on these days, such as social media, TV, movies, or video games.

To help with all this, we will also offer a short time of scripture and prayer, every Wednesday at 12:30 pm, beginning Wednesday, November 30th, in person and over Zoom. Take a break from work, lunch, chores, and join others in prayer. If you come in person, please use the Lorne Street entryway.

Sent team from First Baptist Regina and other churches across Canada

In 2019, a team from First Baptist Regina had the chance to visit, to meet our partners face to face, to see firsthand the incredible work they are doing, and to hear the stories of miracles, healing, and of people coming to Christ. They are inviting us to consider sending another team in 2023.

Canadian Baptist Ministries (CBM) is the national organization of Canadian

Baptists. They support ministry, crisis response, and relief and development within Canada and around the world.

Through CBM we have been partnering with the Lebanese Society for Education and Social Development in Lebanon (LSESD) for six years. It is a remarkable organization, managing a Seminary which trains pastors from across North Africa and the Middle East, a Christian public school, a school for high needs children, a publishing company, the distribution of food and medicine, a shelter, a conference centre, a community peacemaking initiative, and an international conference on ministry in the Middle East and North Africa, just to name a few!

Together with local churches, they have been caring for thousands of Syrian refugees. During the pandemic, they provided food and medical supplies. Now, in the economic crisis, and due to the port explosion of August, 2020, they have been caring for many of their fellow Lebanese.

Every year, we budget support for our partners in Beirut and we hold an annual fundraiser. We pray for our partners and their churches, and for the Lebanese CBM staff, Eli Haddad, Joe Bridi, and Emad Botros and their families.

Come out on Monday evening to hear more about this and the chance to represent our congregation in Beirut.

Tithes and Offerings

- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use a credit or debit card to make a donation from our website. (*The church is charged a small processing fee for each donation.*)
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church 100% of your donation reaches us)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via CanadaHelps (a 3.5% fee is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
