Fasting... at Christmas?!

We are approaching the Advent season, once again welcoming Jesus into our lives and remembering that one day, we will all see Jesus face to face. We are encouraged to let Advent be a time of prayer and preparation for Jesus' advent in our lives.

You may be seeking for something to help you slow down during the Christmas season or something to help you focus on Jesus. Some make use of daily advent reflections. A few are suggested below.

Fasting is also meant to be part of this season. As we read in Ezra and Nehemiah, God's people have always intentionally had times of fasting and times of celebration. Through fasting, we practice our conviction that we do not live by food alone but by God's word imparting life to us. It's impossible for Advent to be as somber a fast as Lent. Like all times of watching for a birth, the preparation and waiting is full of joy.

Perhaps you would consider fasting on the Wednesdays leading up to Christmas.

Fasting can mean taking nothing or sticking to just water. A more common approach is to limit yourself to small portions of whole foods, things like nuts, fruits and vegetables. It has also become common to turn off devices on these days, such as social media, TV, movies, or video games.

To help with all this, we will also offer a short time of scripture and prayer, every Wednesday at 12:30 pm, beginning Wednesday, November 30th, in person and over Zoom. Take a break from work, lunch, chores, and join others in prayer. If you come in person, please use the Lorne Street entryway.

Board chair Ron Phillips and Lead Pastor Joel Russell-MacLean gave reports. We have much to celebrate about our life together, and yet we face significant spiritual and societal challenges. We are an aging congregation in a rapidly changing society. But Jesus is Lord, and we hear his call to faithfulness.

I am completing my final year on the board, as are Tiffany Stafford-Lai and Barry Lyons. I am grateful to them, and to all members of the board for their faithful service.

First Baptist Finances

Here's an update from our fall business meeting on First Baptist's current financial situation. The numbers show our income and expenses to the end of October 2022.

To the end of October, our total revenue is 17% below our YTD budget, reflecting a lower offering income year-to-date than in 2021. Over the same time period, we have kept our expenses to about 12% below YTD budget. Combining these two situations, we have a current deficit of \$18.9K (spending more than our income). We are using a surplus from recent years to offset this difference without requiring a line of credit and in order to continue paying back the loan from our Organ Fund.

Our goal is to achieve a balanced budget by year end so we can continue to focus our attention on the many wonderful ministry opportunities in front of us.

- 2. Establish a **Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) Plan**. This will automatically transfer funds from your account into the FBC Regina account on a regular basis. Please email the church or contact the Treasurer if you would like to set up PAR, or change your commitment.
- 3. Make an online donation:
 - Use a credit or debit card to make a donation from our website. (*The church is charged a small processing fee for each donation.*)
 - Use Interac e-Transfer to donate from your phone or computer to FBCRegina@gmail.com (no fee or cost to the church)
 - Use a credit card with a PayPal account via the **PayPal Giving Fund** (no fee or cost to the church 100% of your donation reaches us)
 - Use a credit card or PayPal via **CanadaHelps** (a 3.5% fee is deducted from the donation)
 - Use a credit or debit card via **FBC ChurchTrac** (the church is charged a fee of approximately 3% for each donation)
