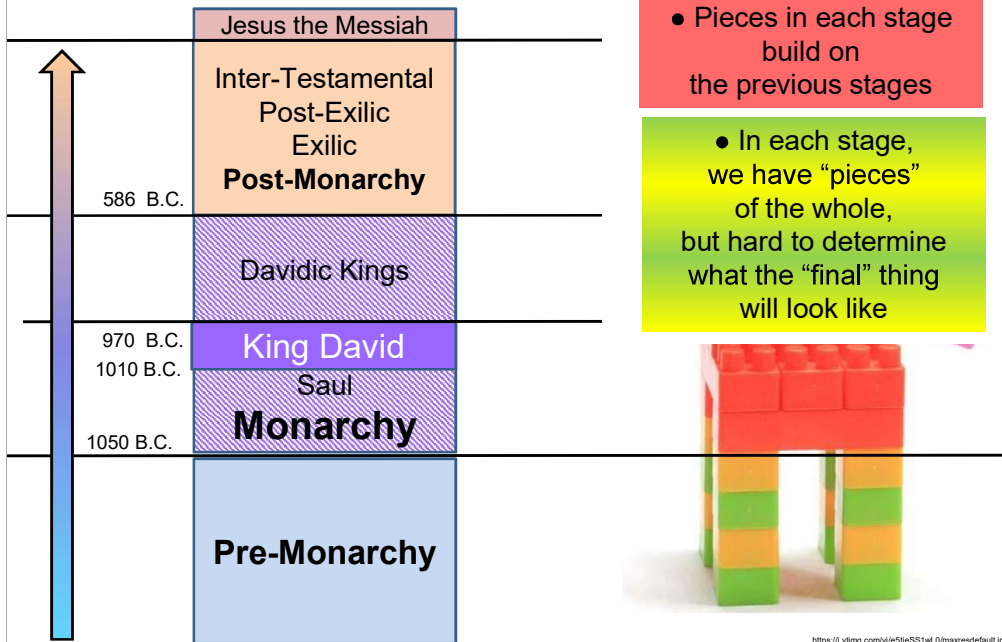

Messianic Expectation in the Old Testament

“messiah” [= “anointed”]

- noun מָשִׁיחַ (mā-šī-ah) = “one who has been anointed”
- Since the term can refer to any person who is “anointed”, **a distinction must be made between**
- “messiah/anointed” in the generic sense of various persons who are anointed to various offices
- & • The “Messiah/Anointed” in the technical sense of the Saviour, Redeemer, Deliverer who comes at the “End of Times”
